I enjoyed this fine review of Jussie's chronicle, but would just quickly point out that the town of Annecy was not located in France as the review indicated (not until the 19th c.), but in the county (duchy after 1564) of the Genevois, a territory subject to the sovereign house of Savoy.

"But where can I learn about the Genevois and its relationship to the rest of the Savoyard lands?" one might ask. Fortunately, a forthcoming volume published by the Librairie Droz (hopefully by the end of 2007) will provide all manner of interesting detail both about the apanage of the Genevois and its sixteenth-century apanagiste, Jacques de Savoie, duc de Genevois-Nemours.
